On April 28, 2003, the Antioch, Rodeo, San Pablo Housing Choice Voucher, and San Pablo Central Waiting List Staff relocated to their new office at 1805 Arnold Drive in Martinez.

This much anticipated move accompanies a change in the way the County of Contra Costa Housing Authority services its clients. Instead of placing staff in teams based on location, staff are now placed in teams based on function. The County of Contra Costa Housing Choice Voucher Program now has five teams to better service our clients.

The **Initial Eligibility Team** administers the Housing Choice Voucher and Public Housing waiting list. 925-957-7003

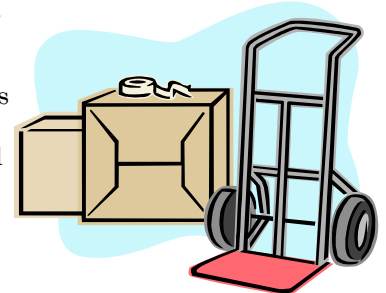
The **Occupancy Team** is responsible for new contracts, tenant moves, and portables. This is the team you contact when you want to move. 925-957-7004

The Housing Authority of The County of Contra Costa has established a new team to meet the needs of the participants on the Family Self-Sufficiency and Shelter Plus Care programs.



If you are an FSS participant the Housing

Services Team (HST) will be responsible for completing your annual and interim re-certifications. This team will also meet with each of you to encourage and monitor your progress. The HST is your support system.

The team consists of: Anissa Albert– Housing Counselor, Joanna Rodriguez-Mendez- Housing Counselor, Lori Sanders– Housing Services Assistant, and Regina Davis– Housing Assistance Manager.

Soon you will receive an introduction letter from your new case-manager.

Success Story : Julie Medina

Julie Medina is a graduate of the FSS program and a new homeowner! She had to have a good sense of balance in order to attain her goals. She is a single mother, a Safeway employee, and a student at Diablo Valley College. While a Section 8/ FSS participant, she served as tenant commissioner on our Advisory Housing Board.

When asked what her greatest challenge has been she states, "Raising children alone is a challenge in itself. It is also difficult to save money when you are low-income and struggling. FSS is your bank account; It's a waste not to do it."

Her advice to participants who might be feeling discouraged is to not give up. "Don't worry about how long a goal takes. Don't get off your path. Too much free time is wasting your time. Find something to fill in your free time that is working towards your goal."

Julie has been taking classes at DVC for almost ten years, one class at a time. She is now a couple units away from her AA Degree and Business Certificate. Once she attains her degree from DVC, Julie's next goal will be to focus on a career path. Her desire is to find a career that is fulfilling.

Purchasing a house was a learning experience. During her home buying experience Julie had to learn along the way. She encourages clients to educate themselves early.

For those that did not finish high school, getting your GED is your first step to moving forward. In order to get your GED (General Educational Development) Credential,



you need to contact your local Adult Education Resource Center, and/or your local community college. They can help you with preparation classes that will assess what you need to study in order to pass the test. With a GED you can gain employment, continue your education, and work towards starting a business of your own.

If you already have your GED or have already graduated from high school, you might take a look at community

colleges. At a community college you can work towards your AA Degree, take classes that enable you to transfer to a four year university, or just take skill building classes of interest to you.

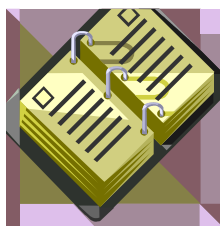
